- We can spot art from different historical periods when looking at portraits
- When using sketching pencils, we can do: Hatching, cross hatching, back and forth stroke, scumbling and stippling

# Cave paintings (linked to Stone Age)

- Cave paintings are paintings on cave walls and ceilings and were made in pre-historic times.
- Most cave paintings date from 10,000 to 20,000 years ago
- Most people think they had a function for rituals or as a way of sharing information
- Most often animals or hunting scenes were painted, although sometimes hands were painted too. The paintings were drawn with red and yellow ochre, hematite, manganese oxide and charcoal.
- Browns, blacks, reds, oranges and white were the most common colours used and lots of lines and shapes were painted.
- Lascaux caves contain the largest collection of cave paintings discovered and this is in the Dordogne in the South West of France.



- Many repeated shapes that fit together like tiles
- Lots of his drawings also featured ceilings that seemed to turn into floors

#### **Egyptian Art**

- Much of the artwork created by the Ancient Egyptians had to do with their religion.
- Much of this artwork was there to help the Pharaohs in the afterlife.
- Temples were another popular place for art.
- The temples often held large statues of their gods as well as many paintings on the walls.
- The Egyptians are famous for their giant works of sculptures.
- They mostly used the colours blue, black, red, green, and gold in their paintings.
- Many of the paintings of Ancient Egypt survived for so many thousands of years because of the extremely dry climate of the area.
- Small carved models were sometimes included inside tombs. These included slaves, animals, boats, and buildings that the person may need in the afterlife.
- A majority of the art hidden in tombs was stolen by thieves over thousands of years.
